AtRial Cardiopathy and Antithrombotic Drugs In Prevention ...

The 2006 American Heart Association / American Stroke Association Council on Stroke Guidelines for Prevention of Stroke in Patients With Ischemic Stroke or Transient Ischemic recommended that patients with cryptogenic stroke take antithrombotic drugs (i.e. aspirin) in order to prevent a second stroke.

Antithrombotic therapies are the mainstays for preventing thromboembolic events in patients with AF. Oral anticoagulation with vitamin K antagonists (VKAs) has long been the gold standard therapy for stroke prevention in these patients.
